



2022 Fort Drum Regional Economic Impact

A Report on the Direct, Indirect, and Induced Impacts of Fort Drum Spending for the Federal Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2022.

The Model:


The Advocate Drum economic impact model for Fort Drum spending is an IMPLAN based model developed by EBP US, Boston, MA. The current model is co-funded by the Development Authority of the North Country. It is maintained in-kind by the Jefferson County Planning Department, which inputs the data to calculate the results. The inputs are provided by Fort Drum in its annual Economic Impact Statement, which only reports direct spending in numerous categories. Our model estimates TOTAL economic impact by identifying the additional indirect and induced impacts through the use of industry-specific multipliers, local purchase coefficients, incometo-output ratios, demographic patterns, and other factors.

Types of Impacts:

Direct Impacts – The direct economic impacts include 1) payroll (military and civilian on-post employees, including contract workers) spent by the US Department of Defense, and 2) non-payroll (outside) spending by the Department of Defense with vendors providing goods and services to Fort Drum.

Indirect Impacts – The indirect economic impacts are additional business sales, off-site jobs, and income supported by Fort Drum's non-payroll expenditures for services and supplies. The magnitude of the total indirect effect depends on the types of purchases made each year and the extent to which those purchases go to businesses located within the tri-county region.

Induced Impacts – The economic result from re-spending of the wages associated with direct and indirect employment. As workers re-spend their income on consumer purchases, they generate business sales and employment in other sectors of the economy.

Gross Output, GRP, and Labor Earnings are alternative views of the same economic impacts and cannot be added together.

Gross Output – Fort Drum's *TOTAL* economic impact. This includes Fort Drum's total payroll and non-payroll spending, plus the additional indirect and induced impacts, as defined on the previous page.

Gross Regional Product (GRP) – GRP is a measure of value-added economic activity occurring within the region. In the case of Fort Drum, it represents the value of its payroll entering the region's economy plus net business profits resulting from Fort Drum related activity.

Labor Earnings – This line indicates Fort Drum's total contribution to personal income in the Tri-County region. It includes the value of Fort Drum's direct payroll entering the economy plus the wage income related to the indirect, off-post jobs supported by Fort Drum economic activity.

Employment – Total Fort Drum related employment includes the military and civilian jobs supported directly by the installation (including contract employees), plus the additional indirect jobs that exist off-post due to Fort Drum's presence in the region.


With 18,920 Military and Civilian personnel, Fort Drum is the largest single-site employer in New York State.

The 24,579 Fort Drum related jobs (direct & indirect) represent 22.0 % of wage earners in the Tri-County region.




Total Employment by County




Fort Drum/Non Fort Drum Related Employment
